

## FOR HIS 72 YEARS of Exemplary Service To The Exchange Club of Culver City And To the Culver Community

- Earl joined the Exchange Club of Culver City (CCEC) in 1951, two years after it was founded.
- He worked his way through committee and chair positions to become President in 1960-61.
- In 1965 he was part of the founding committee for the CCEC Fourth of July Fireworks Show which has become a favorite activity of the Club, and an institution for the City of Culver City for over 60 years.
- In 1998 Earl was nominated by the CCEC for the Lifetime Achievement Award. He received the Award from the California/Nevada District Exchange Clubs.
- Since the founding of the CCEC Charitable Foundation in 2004 Earl has served as the Treasurer. One of his activities each year is to chair the Scholarship Committee which selects the students from CCHS who will receive the numerous scholarships the Club awards each year at Graduation.
- As the member of the CCEC with the longest continuous membership Earl serves as the Club Historian. He is called upon many times to provide information to resolve questions on Club procedures.
- In addition to his involvement with the Exchange Club, Earl is a charter member of the Culver City Elks Lodge, a founder of the Culver City Little League, and an early member of the Chamber of Commerce and Culver Palms YMCA.

**Earl is an asset to the Club and to the Culver City community. He will be awarded the Book of Golden Deeds Award later in 2023.**


# INDEPENDENCE DAY FIREWORKS SHOW

Thank you so much for the generosity shown toward the unhoused and working poor of our community! Your on-going support of Grace Diner has provided thousands of hot meals to those experiencing food and nutritional insecurity here in Culver City.

It's not easy to look Homelessness and Poverty directly in the eye-but that's what the Diner is all about. We provide food and referrals to services in a dignified and compassionate way. We work with St. Joseph's to get people housed. We distribute warm clothes and sleeping bags in the winter. We provide access to a mobile medical van once a month, coordinated with the Department of Health Services. Above all, we treat every "diner" as a friend.

People who stand in our long lines are a cross-section of society: the elderly, the LGBTQ community, veterans, the physically handicapped, the mentally ill, the chronically unhoused, people living in their cars and many many people who have jobs and a roof over their heads, but cannot afford food.

It takes a village to help homeless families get moved into a decent place they can call home. Thankfully, the Exchange Club of Culver City is a major part of the Upward Bound House (UBH) village and has been partnering with us for many years to make that journey to independence for homeless families much easier- and a lot more fun!

Upward Bound House (UBH) was founded in 1990 in response to the affordable housing crisis on the Westside of Los Angeles and its impact on homeless families with children. Currently, we have a 21 unit apartment complex in Santa Monica, an 18 unit converted motel in Culver City and 6 duplexes which serve 50 families in South Los Angeles. Since our inception, UBH has helped over 2,633 families - Including over 5,018 children - transition from homelessness into permanent housing, with over 95% of families remaining stably housed more than one year later.

Over the years, the Exchange Club of Culver City has provided a holiday party for our families including, but not limited to, Santa Claus and gifts. This past holiday season, our residents were surprised by the arrival of Santa in his sleigh! Each year, this event is always met with excitement, joy and lots of smiles from both our staff and residents. We are beyond thankful to the Exchange Club for partnering with us for this wonderful event year after year. Without the support of amazing community partners like you, we wouldn't be able to work towards our end goal of eliminating homelessness among families with minor children in Los Angeles. THANK YOU!
